



⚡ THROWIN' IT BACK: WTSQ NIGHTS & RIVERFRONT VIBES ⚡

In celebration of WTSQ's birth month, we're sharing some special throwbacks from our early days on the scene, including this moment from the first-ever WTSQ Night at Live on the Levee in 2018! Pictured is musician Ron Gallo, who performed that evening alongside local favorites Ona. Before hosting our own night at the event, WTSQ had already been broadcasting every Live on the Levee show for three years, so boaters on the Kanawha River could tune in live as music echoed from the Haddad Riverfront Park stage. In those early days, we ran a cable from our Union Building studio all the way to the soundboard by the stage, eventually upgrading to a wireless setup. Each Friday during the season, WTSQ brought the live experience to listeners at home, while also showing up in person with a merch tent, a donation jug, and familiar faces like former jazz DJ Raf Barker of Keeping the Feel Going and blues DJ Dave O'Brien of Bluesday Tuesday (Blues You Can Use). Stay tuned all month for more WTSQ throwbacks!



Did you know WTSQ's very first anniversary party was so legendary, it literally took place on the roof? That's right - we celebrated one year of community-powered radio on top of the Columbia Gas Building, turning the skyline into our backdrop and the city into our dance floor. The night featured a high-energy performance by Of the Dell, with the incomparable Qiet headlining and bringing the house down - or rather, raising the roof! It was a night of music, celebration, and community that set the tone for everything WTSQ has become since. Here's to more unforgettable nights like that one!
